INTRODUCTION

NETS TO YOU! is a list of (mostly) English language U.S. and Canadian Amateur radio voice nets on frequencies below 30000 kHz. It first appeared in its original form in the early 1990s in the print publications REVIEW OF INTERNATIONAL BROADCASTING and DX LISTENING DIGEST, and during 1998-1999 in REVIEW OF INTERNATIONAL BROADCASTING ON LINE DATA, all edited and published by Glenn Hauser. It now appears as an exclusive public service on the WORLD OF RADIO web site, and cannot be reposted, reproduced, E-mailed, folded, spindled or mutilated without the consent of Glenn Hauser. If you see NETS TO YOU! on a web site other than GLENN HAUSER'S WORLD OF RADIO overflow web site, http://www.w4uvh.net/nets2you.html you are looking at an unauthorized bootleg copy. Accept no substitute! Only on the WORLD OF RADIO web sites will you find the latest edition of the authentic and official version of NETS TO YOU! The WORLD OF RADIO NETS TO YOU! has absolutely no connection to and should not be confused with the commercial web site ``Nets To You`` or the ARRL Santa Barbara Section net list ``Nets to you, fella!`` NETS TO YOU! is not archived, so previous versions are no longer available.

NETS TO YOU! does not claim to list every amateur radio voice net currently active, nor does it guarantee that all nets listed here will be active at the times and on the frequencies given. Uncertainties about schedules from some sources (especially internet web pages and usenet postings, not to mention contradictory information, sometimes from the same source!), plus sudden and unpredictable changes, makes this impossible. However, the compiler does try to keep up with net changes.

Net lengths vary from only a few minutes to several hours for DX and maritime nets. Some nets are roll call only, while others take comments from check ins. Informal sessions may precede and or follow some nets. On any given day, some nets may begin early if a preceding net on the same frequency closes early or does not meet, or if enough check ins show up early. Nets may not meet if propagation conditions are bad, if a net control operator is not available or if there are no check ins. Frequencies can vary widely depending on band conditions and frequency usage at the time. No net, group or person can claim priority of any amateur frequency. Nets on higher frequencies may be suspended or irregular during low sunspot periods. Some nets do not meet or use weekend schedules on holidays. Some nets are inactive during certain parts of the year, or during major contests. Nets on the 40 meter band (7 MHz) can suffer severe interference from broadcast stations, especially in the evenings, overnight, and early mornings, as 7100-7300 kHz is allocated to broadcast in areas outside of ITU Region 2 (the western hemisphere).

AMATEUR RADIO NETS

All times and days are given strictly in Universal Time (UT, aka Universal Coordinated Time, Greenwich Mean Time, or Zulu Time). Between the last Sunday in October and the first Sunday in April (winter or standard time [ST]), refer to the time in the left column; between the first Sunday in April and the last Sunday in October (summer or daylight shifting time [DST]) refer to the time in the right column, even if your area does not observe DST. Nets that remain at the same UT time all year or shift other than one hour earlier during DST are listed twice in the respective columns. If you are not sure what the UT time and day is in your location, go to the National Weather Service`s

Radar FAQ page, http://www.srh.noaa.gov/radar/radinfo/radinfo.html#utc for a conversion chart, which shows UT\local time\day conversions for the mainland US\Canadian time zones as well as the Atlantic, Alaska, Hawaii and Guam time zones. PLEASE REMEMBER THAT, DURING OUR LOCAL EVENINGS IN NORTH AMERICA, IT IS ALREADY THE NEXT DAY BY UT. So, if a net at 0100 is given as being on Tuesday, it is Monday evening North American time (except in the west, where it is still late afternoon on Monday). With minor exceptions, nets will be on lower sideband on frequencies below 7300 kHz or upper sideband on frequencies above 14000 kHz. AM mode nets are noted either in the name or with [AM]. Alternate frequencies, if any, are followed by a small ``a.``

Coverage area: the primary coverage area of the net or its point of origin, unless it is indicated in the net's name (that does not mean, however, that it cannot be heard outside of the specified area or confines check ins to that area). If no coverage area is mentioned, it is either unspecified or the net covers a large part or all of North America.

There are some voice nets in Canada and other parts of North America that operate on frequencies that are not allocated to voice in the United States, such as below 3750, 7150, 14150 and 21200. Do not expect to hear mainland US hams on their nets (hams in Alaska and Hawaii can use those some of those frequencies).

The National Weather Service has a central collection of WSR-88D radar products in process. While we currently only display four of those products (Base Reflectivity, Composite Reflectivity, One-Hour Precipitation, and Storm Total Precipitation) through these local radar pages, you can receive all products through a "multicast" flow or via standard anonymous FTP from the Gateway file servers. Information on the other products and the type of computer equipment you need to receive the products can be found at the Radar Product Central Collection/Distribution
Service webpage.

How does the radar work?

NEXRAD (**Next** Generation **Rad**ar) obtains weather information (precipitation and wind) based upon returned energy. The radar emits a burst of energy (green). If the energy strikes an object (rain drop, bug, bird, etc), the energy is scattered in all directions (blue). A small fraction of that scattered energy is directed back toward the radar.



This reflected signal is then received by the radar during its listening period. Computers analyze the strength of the returned pulse, time it took to travel to the object and back, and phase shift of the pulse. This process of emitting a signal, listening for any returned signal, then emitting the next signal, takes place very fast, up to around 1300 times each second.

NEXRAD spends the vast amount of time "listening" for returning signals it sent. When the time of all the pulses each hour are totaled (the time the radar is actually transmitting), the radar is "on" for about 7 seconds each hour. The remaining 59 minutes and 53 seconds are spent listening for any returned signals.

The ability to detect the "shift in the phase" of the pulse of

energy makes NEXRAD a Doppler radar. The phase of the returning signal typically changes based upon the motion of the raindrops (or bugs, dust, etc.). This Doppler effect was named after the Austrian physicist, Christian Doppler, who discovered it. You have most likely experienced the "Doppler effect" around trains.

As a train passes your location, you may have noticed the pitch in the train's whistle changing from high to low. As the train approaches, the sound waves that make up the



whistle are compressed making the pitch higher than if the train was stationary. Likewise, as the train moves away from you, the sound waves are stretched, lowering the pitch of the whistle. The faster the train moves, the greater the change in the whistle's pitch as it passes your location.

The same effect takes place in the atmosphere as a pulse of energy from NEXRAD strikes an object and is reflected back toward the radar. The radar's computers measure the phase change of the reflected pulse of energy which then convert that change to a velocity of the object, either toward or from the radar. Information on the movement of objects either toward or away from the radar can be used to estimate the speed of the wind. This ability to "see" the wind is what enables the National Weather Service to detect the formation of tornados which, in turn, allows us to

issue tornado warnings with more advanced notice.

Is everything I see on the images an accurate picture of my weather?

Weather surveillance radars such as the WSR-88D can detect most precipitation within approximately 80 nautical miles (nm) of the radar, and intense rain or snow within approximately 140 nm. However, light rain, light snow, or drizzle from shallow cloud weather systems are not necessarily detected.

Echoes from surface targets appear in almost all radar reflectivity images. In the immediate area of the radar, "ground clutter" generally appears within a radius of 20 nm. This appears as a roughly circular region with echoes that show little spatial continuity. It results from radio energy reflected back to the radar from outside the central radar beam, from the earth's surface or buildings.

Under highly stable atmospheric conditions (typically on calm, clear nights), the radar beam can be refracted almost directly into the ground at some distance from the radar, resulting in an area of intense-looking echoes. This "anomalous propagation" phenomenon (commonly known as AP) is much less common than ground clutter. Certain sites situated at low elevations on coastlines regularly detect "sea return", a phenomenon similar to ground clutter except that the echoes come from ocean waves.

Returns from aerial targets are also rather common. Echoes from migrating birds regularly appear during nighttime hours between late February and late May, and again from August through early November. Return from insects is sometimes apparent during July and August. The apparent intensity and areal coverage of these features is partly dependent on radio propagation conditions, but they usually appear within 30 nm of the radar and produce reflectivities of <30 dBZ (decibels of Z).

However, during the peaks of the bird migration seasons, in April and early September, extensive areas of the south-central U.S. may be covered by such echoes. Finally, aircraft often appear as "point targets" far from the radar, particularly in composite reflectivity images.

The radar is also limited close in by its inability to scan directly overhead. Therefore, close to the radar, data are not available due to the radar's maximum tilt elevation of 19.5°. This area is commonly referred to as the radar's "Cone of Silence".

Though surface echoes appear in the base and composite reflectivity images, special automated error checking generally removes their effects from precipitation accumulation products. The national reflectivity mosaic product is also automatically edited to detect and remove most nonprecipitation features. Even with limited experience, users of unedited products can differentiate precipitation from other echoes, if they are aware of the general meteorological situation.

What are the different types of radar images?

Base Reflectivity

This is a display of echo intensity (reflectivity) measured in **dBZ** (decibels of Z, where Z represents the energy reflected back to the radar). "Reflectivity" is the amount of transmitted power returned to the radar receiver. Base Reflectivity images are available at several different elevation angles (tilts) of the antenna and are used to detect precipitation, evaluate storm structure, locate atmospheric boundaries and determine hail potential.

The base reflectivity image currently available on this website is from the lowest "tilt" angle (0.5°). This means the radar's antenna is tilted 0.5° above the horizon.

The maximum range of the "short range" (S Rng) base reflectivity product is 124 nm (about 143 miles) from the radar location. This view will not display echoes that are more distant than 124 nm, even though precipitation may be occurring at greater distances. To determine if precipitation is occurring at greater distances, select the "long range" (L Rng) view (out to 248 nm/286 mi), select an adjacent radar, or link to the National Reflectivity Mosaic.

Composite Reflectivity

This display is of maximum echo intensity (reflectivity) from any elevation angle at every range from the radar. This product is used to reveal the highest reflectivity in all echoes. When compared with Base Reflectivity, the Composite Reflectivity can reveal important storm structure features and intensity trends of storms.

The maximum range of the "long range" (L Rng) composite reflectivity product is **248** nm (about **286** miles) from the radar location. The "blocky" appearance of this product is due to its lower spatial resolution on a **2.2** * **2.2** nm grid. It has one-fourth the resolution of the Base Reflectivity and one-half the resolution of the Precipitation products.

Although the Composite Reflectivity product is able to display maximum echo intensities 248 nm from the radar, the beam of the radar at this distance is at a very high altitude in the atmosphere. Thus, only the most intense convective storms and tropical systems will be detected at the longer distances.

Because of this fact, special care must be taken interpreting this product. While the radar image may not indicate precipitation it's quite possible that the radar beam is overshooting precipitation at lower levels, especially at greater distances. To determine if precipitation is occurring at greater distances link to an adjacent radar or link to the National Reflectivity Mosaic.

For a **higher resolution (1.1 * 1.1 nm grid)** composite reflectivity image, select the **short range** (S Rng) view. The image is less "blocky" as compared to the long range image. However, the maximum range is reduced to 124 nm (about 143 miles) from the radar location.

One-hour Precipitation

This is an image of estimated one-hour precipitation accumulation on a 1.1 nm by 1 degree grid. This product is used to assess rainfall intensities for flash flood warnings, urban flood statements and special weather statements. The maximum range of this product is 124 nm (about 143 miles) from the radar location. This product will not display accumulated precipitation more distant than 124 nm, even though precipitation may be occurring at greater distances. To determine accumulated precipitation at greater distances you should link to an adjacent radar.

Storm Total Precipitation

This image is of estimated accumulated rainfall, continuously updated, since the last one-hour break in precipitation. This product is used to locate flood potential over urban or rural areas, estimate total basin runoff and provide rainfall accumulations for the duration of the event.


The maximum range of this product is 124 nm (about 143 miles) from the radar location. This product will not display accumulated precipitation more distant than 124 nm, even though precipitation may be occurring at greater distances. To determine accumulated precipitation at greater distances link to an adjacent radar.

How often are the images updated?

Image updates are based upon the operation mode of the radar at the time the image is generated. The WSR-88D Doppler radar is operated in one of two modes -- clear air mode or precipitation mode. In clear air mode, images are updated every 10 minutes. In precipitation mode, images are updated every five or six minutes. The collection of radar data, repeated at regular time intervals, is referred to as a volume scan.

Clear Air Mode

In this mode, the radar is in its most sensitive operation. This mode has the slowest antenna rotation rate which permits the radar to sample a given volume of the atmosphere longer. This increased sampling increases the radar's sensitivity and ability to detect smaller objects in the atmosphere than in precipitation mode. A lot of what you will see in clear air mode will be airborne dust and particulate matter. Also, snow does not reflect energy sent from the radar very well. Therefore, clear air mode will occasionally be used for the detection of light snow.




The radar continuously scans the atmosphere by completing volume coverage patterns (VCP). A VCP consists of the radar making several 360° scans of the atmosphere, sampling a set of increasing elevation angles. There are two clear mode VCPs.

In clear air mode, the radar begins a volume scan at the 0.5° elevation angle (i.e., the radar antenna is angled 0.5° above the ground). Once it makes two full sweeps (a surveillance/reflectivity sweep and a Doppler/velocity sweep) at the 0.5° elevation angle, it increases to 1.5° and makes two more 360° rotations. For one of the clear air mode VCPs, two full sweeps are also made at 2.5°. Otherwise, at the higher elevations (2.5°, 3.5°, and 4.5°) a single sweep is made (reflectivity and velocity data are collected together).

This process is repeated at 2.5°, 3.5°, and 4.5°. Then the radar returns to the 0.5° elevation angle to begin the next volume scan which will repeat the same sequence of elevation angles. In clear air mode, the complete scan of the atmosphere takes about 10 minutes at 5 different elevation angles.


Precipitation Mode

When precipitation is occurring, the radar does not need to be as sensitive as in clear air mode as rain provides plenty of returning signals. At the same time, meteorologists want to see higher in the atmosphere when precipitation is occurring to analyze the vertical structure of the storms. This is when the meteorologists switch the radar to precipitation mode using one of two volume coverage patterns.




Both precipitation VCP's begin like the clear air mode mentioned above with the same evaluations scans as in the clear air mode. The difference is the radar continues looking higher in the atmosphere, up to 19.5° to complete the volume scan. The time it takes to complete the entire volume scan is also less. In the slower VCP, the radar completes the volume scan of nine different elevations in six minutes. In the faster VCP, the radar completes 14 different elevation scans in five minutes.

Differences in the quality of radar images between the two precipitation mode VCPs are relatively minor. Therefore, during severe weather, the faster VCP is almost always used as it provides the meteorologists with the quickest updates and most elevation slices through the storms.



In summary, when the radar is in clear air mode, radar images will be updated approximately every ten minutes. In precipitation mode, the updates will occur around five to six minutes apart.

What do the colors mean in the reflectivity products?



The colors are the different echo intensities (reflectivity) measured in dBZ (decibels of Z) during each elevation scan. "Reflectivity" is the amount of transmitted power returned to the radar receiver. Reflectivity (designated by the letter Z) covers a wide range of signals (from very weak to very strong). So, a more convenient number for calculations and comparison, a decibel (or logarithmic) scale (dBZ), is used.

The dBZ values increase as the strength of the signal returned to the radar increases. Each reflectivity image you see includes one of two color scales. One scale (far left) represents dBZ values when the radar is in clear air mode (dBZ values from -28 to +28). The other scale (near left) represents dBZ values when the radar is in precipitation mode (dBZ values from 5 to 75). Notice the color on each scale remains the same in both operational modes, only the values change. The value of the dBZ depends upon the mode the radar is in at the time the image was created.

The scale of dBZ values is also related to the intensity of rainfall. Typically, light rain is occurring when the dBZ value reaches 20. The higher the dBZ, the stronger the rainrate. Depending on the type of weather occurring and the area of the U.S., forecasters use a set of rainrates which are associated to the dBZ values.

These values are estimates of the rainfall per hour, updated each volume scan, with rainfall accumulated over time. Hail is a good reflector of energy and will return very high dBZ values. Since hail can cause the rainfall estimates to be higher than what is actually occurring, steps are


taken to prevent these high dBZ values from being converted to rainfall.


What is the difference between base and composite reflectivity?

The main difference is composite reflectivity shows the highest dBZ (strongest reflected energy) at all elevation scans, not just the reflected energy at a single elevation scan. This can be seen in the images below from the Salt Lake City radar.

Notice the additional reflectivity that is visible in the composite reflectivity (far right). It is most readily seen around the name 'Wendover'. Also notice the composite view displays a slightly larger area of heavy rain (orange-red area to the west of Wendover).

Why the difference? Base reflectivity only shows reflected energy at a single elevation scan of the radar. Composite reflectivity displays the highest reflectivity of *ALL* elevations scans. So, if heavier precipitation is higher in the atmosphere over an area of





lighter precipitation (the heavier rain that has yet to reach the ground), the composite reflectivity image will display the stronger dBZ level.

This occurs often with severe thunderstorms. The updraft, which feeds the thunderstorm with moist air, is strong enough to keep a large amount of water aloft. Once the updraft can no longer support the weight of suspended water then the rain intensity at the surface increases as the rain falls from the cloud.

What is UTC Time?

Weather observations around the world (including radar observations) are always taken with respect to a standard time. By convention, the world's weather communities use a twenty four hour clock, similar to "military" time based on the 0° longitude meridian, also known as the Greenwich meridian.

Prior to 1972, this time was called Greenwich Mean Time (GMT) but is now referred to as Coordinated Universal Time or Universal Time Coordinated (UTC). It is a coordinated time scale, maintained by the Bureau International des Poids et Mesures (BIPM). It is also known a "Z time" or "Zulu Time".

To obtain your local time here in the United States, you need to subtract a certain number of hours from UTC depending on how many time zones you are away from Greenwich (England). The table (right) shows the standard difference from UTC time to local time.

The switch to daylight saving time does not affect UTC. It refers to time on the zero or Greenwich meridian, which is not adjusted to reflect changes either to or from Daylight Saving Time.

However, you need to know what happens during daylight saving time in the United States. In short,

the local time is advanced one hour during daylight saving time. As an example, the Eastern Time zone difference from UTC is a -4 hours during daylight saving time rather than -5 hours as it is during standard time.

Ham radio contact with Pitcairn Island

Long before the coming of the Internet, and well before telephone was available, Pitcairn Island maintained contact with the outside world by amateur ("ham") radio. The beginning of Pitcairn's off-island amateur radio contact goes back to 1921 when Captain F. A. Hemming, Master of the New Zealand Shipping Company's vessel

Rimutaka gave Fred Christian, Pitcairn's magistrate, a card bearing a Morse Code communication. That led to contact with passing ships using simple crystal sets, and later to the use of ham radio rigs by Pitcairners which could reach around the world. At one time or another there has probably been a higher per capita use of ham radio by Pitcairners than any other place in the world. Even today, with both telephone and e-mail available, ham radio continues to be a popular communication form on Pitcairn Island.

Between 3:30 and 5 p.m., Pacific Standard Time (2330 to 0100 UTC) on Tuesdays, Tom Christian (VP6TC) is on the air at 21.348 MHz, or at 14.181 MHz if the primary frequency is poor.

At 9 a.m., Pacific Standard Time (1700 UTC) on Wednesdays, Betty Christian (VP6YL) is available at 21.325 MHz. (Note: Betty is away from Pitcairn until mid-September 2003.)

At 9 a.m., Pacific Standard Time (1700 UTC) on Fridays, you might be able to speak with Tom Christian (VP6TC) at 21.248 MHz.

W1AW's schedule is at the same local time throughout the year. The schedule according to your local time will change if your local time does not have seasonal adjustments that are made at the same time as North American time changes between standard time and daylight time. From the first Sunday in April to the last Sunday in October, UTC (Coordinated Universal Time) = Eastern Time + 4 hours. For the rest of the year, UTC = Eastern Time + 5 hours.

Morse Code Transmissions

Frequencies are 1.8175, 3.5815, 7.0475, 14.0475, 18.0975, 21.0675, 28.0675 and 147.555 MHz.

Slow Code = practice sent at 5, 7-1/2, 10, 13 and 15 words per minute (wpm).

Fast Code = practice sent at 35, 30, 25, 20, 15, 13 and 10 wpm.

Code practice text is from the pages of *QST* magazine, the League's membership journal. The source is given at the beginning of each practice session and alternate speeds within each session. For example, "Text is from July 1992 *QST*, pages 9 and 81," indicates that the practice session's plain text is from the article on page 9 and its mixed number/letter groups are from page 81.

Code bulletins are sent at 18 wpm.

CW frequencies include code practices, Qualifying Runs and CW bulletins.

World Wide Web: You can also find <u>W1AW code practice</u> here on *ARRLWeb*, in MP3 format. Other resources can be found on the *ARRLWeb* Learn CW page.

W1AW Qualifying Runs are sent on the same frequencies as the Morse code transmissions. West Coast qualifying runs are transmitted on approximately 3.590 MHz K6YR. At the beginning of each code practice session, the schedule for the next qualifying run is presented. Underline one minute of the highest speed you copied, certify that your copy was made without aid, and send it to ARRL for grading. Please include your name, call sign (if any) and complete mailing address. The initial certificate is available for a \$10 fee. Subsequent endorsement stickers are available for a \$7.50 fee.

Teleprinter Transmissions

Frequencies are 3.625, 7.095, 14.095, 18.1025, 21.095, 28.095 and 147.555 MHz.

Bulletins are sent at 45.45-baud Baudot and 100-baud AMTOR, FEC Mode B, 110-baud ASCII will be sent only as time allows.

Keplerian elements for many amateur satellites will be sent on the regular teleprinter frequencies on Tuesdays and Fridays at 6:30 PM Eastern Time.

Voice Transmissions

Frequencies are 1.855, 3.99, 7.29, 14.29, 18.16, 21.39, 28.59 and 147.555 MHz.

Miscellanea

A DX bulletin replaces or is added to the regular bulletins between 8 P.M. Eastern time Thursdays and 8 P.M. Eastern time Fridays.

ARRL Headquarters and W1AW are closed on New Year's Day; Presidents' Day; Good Friday, Memorial Day; Independence Day; Labor Day; Thanksgiving and the following Friday; and Christmas Day.

In a communications emergency, monitor W1AW for special bulletins as follows: voice on the hour, teleprinter at 15 minutes past the hour, and CW on the half hour.

QSL Policy

A number of years ago, it was required that visiting operators make out QSL cards for each and every contact they made while QRV from W1AW.

While in the long-standing tradition of QSLing this once made perfect sense, over time it became apparent that this process lessened the importance of the QSL card. And, if nothing else, printing and postage costs became much more of an issue.

Therefore, we ask that amateurs who work us and would like a W1AW QSL card to send us theirs first and to please include a **SASE** (Self-Addressed-Stamped-Envelope). Foreign stations may either QSL in a like manner (but send along an IRC) or just "via the bureau."



History of The Gateway 160 Meter Net; and The Gateway 160 Meter Radio Newsletter.

The Net began with a group of seven amateurs on 160 Meters on Wednesday May 1, 1979, on 1815 KHz. It was formed to promote 160 Meter operation; and form friendships between amateurs using the band; and to provide technical assistance for newcomers or old hands alike to 160. Also to encourage operation on 160 Meters on a regular basis throughout the year to help thwart FCC attempts to re-assign the lower part of the band (up to 1860 KHz) to AM Broadcast band use, due to under utilization by the Amateur service; (Sound familiar?) at W.A.R.C. 79. At that time; Amateur stations in the US and Canada had maximum use of and privileges, on frequencies in the 1800 to 1825 KHz range. Stations had more severe limitations; or were not authorized operation at all; on frequencies between 1825 and 2000 KHz, due to operation of LORAN A Radiolocation. In the years between 1979 and 1982, US limitations between 1825 and 2000 KHz were greatly eased; but Canadian stations (who made up 15 - 20 % of Net Check ins) were still under more severe limitations, or prohibitions on operations between 1825 and 2000 KHz, by DOC.

The Gateway 160 Meter Radio Newsletter began in July 1979. It emphasized 160 Meter activities and general concerns and news of interest to the Amateur Radio Community. With adoption of the ARRL Band plan in January 1982, and after much consideration with Net regulars and others in HAM radio, the decision was made around the beginning of February; to move to 1860 KHz. The FCC had opened 1800 to 1900 KHz, (Primary Allocation) for full time, full power operation by mainland US Amateur stations; and Canadian stations also enjoyed new greatly increased authorizations below 1875 KHz, on a full time basis. Also the ARRL. Band Plan stipulated all scheduled phone operations be assigned frequencies between 1855 and 2000 KHz. These, plus several technical considerations led us to select 1860 KHz for the new net frequency. Extensive monitoring of the band afternoons and evenings revealed no existing scheduled operation on this frequency. On April 14, 1982 The Gateway 160 Meter Net began operation on the new frequency of 1860 KHz.

As mentioned earlier, The Gateway 160 Meter Radio Newsletter began during the Net in July 1979. Originally all items were read live from ARRL. and other sources. In September 1986, one of our regular Net members suggested that we also carry "The Westlink Amateur Network" for weekly ten minute newscasts. His local 2 Meter repeater had been carying Westlink for some time; but when traveling out of town on business or vacation, he missed being able to hear the service. With our Net coverage area from WAORCR of 42 States and 6 Canadian Provinces, the Net was a natural to provide wide area nighttime coverage of this fine service. Westlink News was added in October 1986, to supplement our Gateway 160 Meter Net Radio Newsletter on Wednesday nights. Around January 1987, it was suggested that the Net provide Westlink News Network at other times also, so that those who were not able to hear it on the Net could still catch the service at other times, propagation permitting. This allowed HAM's working second shift; Wednesday meetings; Church Choir practice; etc., to keep informed. After consideration, Westlink was aired on a schedule of 9 times a week; various times of the day as a service of the Gateway 160 Meter Net. In December of 1987, a new amateur radio

information network service "The BEAR Information Service" (later changed in 1988 to the "Radio Amateur Information Network", or RAIN) was added to the nine weekly information bulletins on 1860 KHz. The service was called "Ham News" until mid 1989 when the name was changed to "The Gateway 160 Meter Radio Newsletter" to link it in listeners minds with The Gateway 160 Meter Net. The bulletin schedule was fine tuned several times to provide the greatest service to the Amateur Community, while fitting into a weekly timetable that myself, and two other control operators could provide.

In April 1992, a satellite receiving system was installed; to allow receiving and airing of "Amateur Radio Weekly" from Los Angeles; (with a change in ownership in 1994; now known as "This Week In Amateur Radio") and "The Houston AMSAT Net;" both on the old "Let's Talk Radio Network." This allowed real time airing of nationwide amateur radio programming; without relying on long distance phone lines or multi-port Teleconference Bridge Networks; fed through phone hybrids, as in the past. The phone line charges used to run over \$ 26 for a two hour program, on a weekend. During many satellite networks beginning and then dying, The Gateway 160 Meter Radio Newsletter has continued to follow and carry these two excellent services. During times when no satellite distribution was available; these services would continue; fed by long distance phone line, to station WAORCR. Amateurs could then listen directly; or feed the received audio to a local simplex or repeater frequency, for local distribution. Between 1989 and 1995; WAORCR carried the IARN (International Amateur Radio Network) bulletin service 3 times a week, as a stand alone service, on 160 Meters. About this time, we began carrying St. Louis Amateur Radio Newsline; with news and classes/exam sessions from round the St. Louis, Missouri regional area. We have always carried Hamfest and Convention announcements; from around the nation; sent to the station for airing. These will soon be added to our Web Site, as well. The Gateway 160 Meter Radio Newsletter carried the launch of the Micro Sats and several space launches by phone line and satellite. In September 1996, due to job changes (I had started my own trucking company in November 1995); I was forced to discontinue "The Gateway 160 Meter Net" on Wednesday nights. The last net was called on September 25, 1996. With sadness I announced that I could no longer meet business commitments and continue as Net Manager and regular NCS. I announced that the Gateway 160 Meter Radio Newsletter would continue on Saturday Afternoon and Evening. Programming not occurring live on Saturday would be tape recorded for Saturday airing. This would be a full service bulletin, with all of the regular bulletin programming airing back to back all Saturday afternoon and evening. In addition, we occasionally carry special live programming, such as The AMSAT Symposium, which aired all Friday and Saturday 9am to 6pm, last October These special services will be announced on air and through our Web site, in the future. Myself; my XYL Dottie, KG0VN; and Bob KA0TVO handle programing; production; taping; and Control Operator duties at WA0RCR. Bringing you The Gateway 160 Meter Radio Newsletter on a reliable basis. (I am always looking for a couple more local radio amateurs, to assist in control operator duties. Of course, control OP's must hold at least a General Class Amateur Operator license.)

This service continues to this day, 21 years after it's inception; on Saturdays from 1pm Central until after 2am Sunday morning on 1860 KHz.

Credit Card Applications and/or Renewals: The best way to make a new application or to renew is via regular post. However, U.S members who wish to charge their apppications or renewals to a credit card may use a FAX to 402-891-2481. An approved new member application or renewal form (such as the ones available at this site) must be used. Since a credit card charge is involved, credit card information must include the cardholder's name, telephone number, and cardholder's signature. At present, internet application and renewal are not available because security cannot be assured by this route.

19-19 The Business Side

19-19 Operating Contests

Each year, 10-10 sponsors 2 CW contests and 2 phone contests to encourage maximum cordial activity on the 10-meter band. In addition, there is a 10-10 Day (October 10) 24-hour Sprint. A 10-10 QSO Party brochure is available from the Information Manager or the Contest Manager, although almost all of the information is available in the following listings:

Contest Calendar: a list of the dates and times for the 4 10-10 annual QSO parties and the 10-10 Day Sprint for the coming year

Contest Rules: a uniform set of rules for all 10-10 contests, including the 10-10 Day Sprint.

Cover Sheet: a form that must accompany all contest entries.

<u>Contest Results</u>: listings of the most recent contest results, with the understanding the they are preliminary. Official results appear in the *10-10 News*.

A number of <u>useful contest and DX-related forms</u> can be downloaded in .PDF format for those who have a copy of Acrobat Reader 4.0 (available free from Adobe). These forms will permit you to print perfect copies, since they are pre-formatted and do not need trial versions to set your browser font size. The forms are made available thanks to the work of Bob Munro, W1AMF.

10-10 Operating Awards

10-10 sponsors many categories of operating achievement awards for its members. Among them are 10-10 WAS, DX Countries Award, certificates for working 10-10 members, 10-10 WAC, 10-10 Mobile, and many others.

To open the file, you must unZIP it and use it on your own PC. Place the downloaded file in a directory called XXIQ when you unZip the file and use it.

XXIQ for MAC, is a version of XXIQ written by Phil Heaton, N4BBQ, #66137, for the Mac OS X. The main link will take you to Phil's site, while you may download directly from this link.

FCC Database and Search Programs, supplied and regularly updated by K4HAV. These are programs, described on Jim's instruction pages, that allow you to download a ZIPped FCC database that is either complete (very large) or restricted to 10-10 members (moderate), along with ZIPped search and support programs. Once you unZIP the files, you can search the database offline for QSL and list-swap information.

WhichNet, by N9UKX of the Steel City Chapter. Gives you a look at which net is currently on and a way to look up nets for specific times and days.

On-Line Call Sign Look-up is available at this link, maintained by WM7D. Use this link to obtain addresses for QSLing.







Hurricane Charley made its way across Florida, passing directly over the Orlando Executive Airport, home of the AMSAT Laboratory. Hurricane Charley hit Orlando about 8pm EDT August 13, 2004 with sustained winds estimated at about 100mph. These photographs were taken by Lou McFadin W5DID on August 18th, five days after the hurricane hit.

Fortunately the AMSAT members in the area survived with relatively minor damage but the hangar that houses that AMSAT Lab has been condemned due to structural damage and will have to be torn down. AMSAT's equipment and parts



inventory are in good shape but AMSAT has less than two weeks to move out and find temporary storage for our equipment. We will also need to begin a search for a new facility to support the Eagle satellite development.

ISS Cross Band Repeater Off

The crossband repeater experiment, announced August 28, was shut down with the other ARISS gear September 2 in preparation for a September 3 space walk. The Amateur Radio equipment aboard the ISS will be powered back up no sooner than 1700 UTC on September 4, said ISS Ham Radio Project Engineer Ken Ransom, N5VHC.

Astronaut Mike Fincke [KE5AIT] reported hearing stations actively using the repeater over North America, the southern portion of South America, South Africa, Europe, Australia and Japan," Ransom said. Fincke himself made QSO's using the callsign NA1SS.

The Phase 2 gear was scheduled to return to RS0ISS packet operation following the space walk, but the repeater experiment could be back for a "repeat" performance. ARISS International Team Chairman Frank Bauer, KA3HDO, said the crossband repeater test provided an opportunity to further experiment with the ISS Amateur Radio system.



FEMA seeks help for hurricane recovery (Sep 3, 2004) -- The Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) is urgently seeking "at least a few hundred additional personnel" in the Atlanta, Georgia, area or in the southeastern US to help with a large-scale community relations task shortly after Hurricane Frances makes landfall. Individuals will be paid for their services and do not have to be Amateur Radio licensees. The mission is to distribute vitally important public information literature including urging people in the disaster area to apply to FEMA for help. These are temporary paid FEMA Reservist positions for periods of two weeks minimum. Those responding must be physically able to

work in a disaster area without refrigeration for medications and have the ability to work in the outdoors for at least 12 hours a day under high temperature/high humidity conditions. FEMA will provide transportation from the Atlanta area to various parts of the disaster-affected area. For further information on how to respond, call the Community Relations Coordination Hotline, toll-free, 888 422-4965. The <u>US Department of Homeland Security</u>, of which FEMA is a part, this week has been positioning personnel and supplies in areas expected to be affected by Hurricane Frances to ensure readiness to provide immediate emergency assistance when the storm makes landfall. FEMA also is coordinating activities of other federal departments and with state agencies to prepare for a possible rapid response to the storm.--Ben Curran, FEMA Recovery Division



Hurricane Net, WX4NHC Continue Helping Forecasters Track Frances (Sep 3, 2004) -- For the third day, the Hurricane Watch Net (HWN) on 14.325 MHz has worked hand-in-hand with WX4NHC at the National Hurricane Center (NHC) to relay weather data and damage reports as a downgraded Hurricane Frances continues on what appears to be an inevitable collision with Florida's Atlantic Coast.

Stanley L. Burghardt, W0IT, SK (Sep 3, 2004) -- Stan Burghardt, W0IT (ex-W0BJV), of Watertown, South Dakota, died August 22. He was 93. He was the founder of Burghardt Radio Supply Inc (now Burghardt Amateur Center). Licensed in 1931 as W9BJV (which became W0BJV in 1946), Burghardt remained active on the air--especially on 6 meters--until his death. He also had been active in satellite work and was a member of ARRL, AMSAT and SMIRK. Burghardt started out selling ham radio parts in 1937 and in the 1950s expanded his Watertown operation into a popular Amateur Radio equipment supplier. The company has been a regular *QST* advertiser for the past 50 years, and many early ads featured a photo of Burghardt with his signature. Burghardt sold the business to Jim Smith, W0MJY, but he remained active in the company until January 2002. A service was held September 1.







The NCVA supports the FRUPAC amateur radio operators net. The prime objective of this group is to utilize ham radio to locate former shipmates and provide all with an organized and convenient means of establishing and maintaining contact with each other from the comfort of their respective homes. This is done by scheduling a variety of radio nets that meet regularly on the amateur bands.

Initiated in 1973, the continually expanding roster now has 514 former shipmates with currently valid ham calls. Included are 8 of the original 20G pioneer D.C. operator's school graduates organized as "On-The-Roof" Gang (OTRG).

From the beginning, it was apparent that an identifiable title was needed for the expanding group and nets. The acronym "FRUPAC" (Fleet Radio Unit, Pacific) was selected to commemorate that most successful WWII organization and its supporting personnel; also it was considered the most meaningful term that could best be related to by the greatest number of Naval Cryptologic veterans.



What is the GERATOL NET?

GERATOL - The Acronym. Greetings Extra Radio Amateurs Tired of Operating Lately.

The group operating on the GERATOL NET is often mistaken to be a group of older hams. This is not the case. Net participants include hams of all ages, both OMs and YLs from all states and the Canadian Provinces.

NET PURPOSE

The purpose of the GERATOL NET is to assist properly licensed amateur radio operators in obtaining the GERATOL Net 75-Meter, 2-Letter Extra Class serialized UNBELIEVABLE OPERATING ACHIEVEMENT Award. The award, also known as the Geratol Basic Award, is issued by the GERATOL Net for working and having confirmed, all 50 states within the EXTRA class segment (3.750-3.775 MHz.) of the American 75 meter phone band with 1X2, 2X1, 2X2A calls and 2X2 (AH6, KH6, WH6 in HI) and (AL7, KL7, WL7 in AK) extra class format call signs.

The GERATOL NET also offers thirty-five interesting and challenging endorsements to add to the **Basic Award**, as well as endorsements to the **Directors Award** in increments of 100.

NET OPERATING TIME AND LOCATION

The **GERATOL NET** meets each evening at 01:00Z from October 1 through April 30. Operation generally begins with an eastern net control and proceeds west. Exceptions are when a contest is in progress, then the net controls may opt to shut net operations down.

The **GERATOL NET** meets on 3.768 MHz +/-; however, contacts for the special <u>Unbelievable Operating Achievement Award</u> and **GERATOL** endorsements can be made anywhere within the Extra Class American phone subband - 3.750 - 3.775 MHz.
